BOURNEMOUTH UNIVERSITY POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS POLICY AND PROCESS

Academic year intake 2015-16

2. Application process and eligibility

2.1 With the exception of the BU International Partnership Scholarship, BU International Partnership Excellence Scholarship, Sports or Music Scholarships, Early Confirmation Discount, and Discretionary in-country awards (under Opportunity Scholarship as a recruitment tactic), students are only entitled to be awarded one BU Scholarship in any given academic year. Eligibility criteria for each category of Scholarship are laid out in Section 6.

2.2 Scholarships are awarded for the first year of study at BU only. Students repeating units/years are not eligible.

2.3 All PG Scholarships represent a tuition fee discount/waiver, based on the published full fee amount.

2.4 Students may apply for up to two scholarships (in order of preference for consideration) using a standard application form available on the BU website. Students who meet the criteria for more than one award will automatically receive the scholarship with the highest value. If they are unsuccessful in both awards, they may be recommended for other suitable awards (normally at a lower value) by International or UK Marketing and Student Recruitment Manager. The awarding School then decide if an award will be offered in such cases.

2.5 Completed application forms should be submitted to askBU by email at askBUstudents@bournemouth.ac.uk or by post to: The Base, Talbot Campus, Fern Barrow, Poole, BH12 5BB, UK.

2.6 Consideration will be given to all eligible applications provided the application is received before the published deadline. Applications for scholarship received after the published deadlines will not normally be considered.

2.7 An annual scholarship process timeline is found in the Appendix (internal only) and updated annually.

3. Appeals

3.1 Unsuccessful applicants wishing to appeal should write to the Quality & Enhancement Officer within 10 working days of being notified of the outcome of their application stating clearly the grounds for appeal.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

All students joining the University in September 2015 and January 2016 who meet the University's published criteria for a Postgraduate Academic (Excellence) Scholarship will receive the award.

Students will be required to complete an application form and personal statement, outlining what makes them an outstanding applicant for BU. Scholarships are awarded for the first year of study at BU only. Students repeating units/years are not eligible.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

One scholarship is available for September 2015 entry. Applications must be submitted by 31 May 2015. IMSRT will review applications focusing on the student's personal statement and academic results, before making recommendations (top 5) to the Vice Chancellor – who will ultimately decide on the successful applicant.

Criteria:	Scholarships are available to talented athletes in all sports within the British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) domestic programme. Generally students should demonstrate excellence in sport at national or international level of competition.
Value of award:	No monetary value is attached to this scholarship, the EXCEL Scholarship provides athletes with the following: Free gym membership Free strength and conditioning training Free weekly 30 minute sports massage therapy treatment Free chiropractic treatments

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

Students can qualify for both the BU Sports and sportBU EXCEL Scholarships in the same year.

The deadline for applications is the 30 September 2015 for September 2015 entry and 6 January 2016 for January 2016 entry.

6.17 BU Music Scholarships

Mode of Attendance:	Full time
Place of Attendance:	BU campus
Fee Category:	UK/EU/non-EU
Level of Study:	Postgraduate (Taught Master's)
Criteria:	Students must be able to demonstrate that they are a talented instrumentalist or vocalist, and have been involved in ensemble activity. To be considered for the major award students will need to have reached at least Grade 8 of the Associated Board or the equivalent level in their main instrument/voice. As well as have an academic grounding in music, such as A-level or Grade 8 theory. Students must also demonstrate how they wish to develop musically, as well as academically.
Value of award:	Two types of Music Scholarship may be awarded: A Major award is worth £1,000 A Minor award is worth around £300.

Scholarships can be paid in kind (tuition and equipment) or in cash.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion

The deadline for applications is 15 November 2015 for September 2015 entry and 6 January 2016 for January 2016 entry.

All students who are shortlisted will be invited to an audition.

Students will be expected to take regular lessons on their main instrument or voice with one of the University's tutors and the cost of lessons will be deducted from the scholarship fund at source.
